Legion seeking any and all who served for commemorative publication

The Royal Canadian Legion is embarking on a special commemorative project, and branches across the country are putting out the call for any who served to get in touch.

The Legion is producing a book compiling all Canadian veterans who are still living, along with their stories.

Ray LeClair, a member of the executive of Branch 24 in Cranbrook, says there are many veterans who have never belonged to a branch. While this is not an issue, the Legion wants to list all veterans and pay tribute to them, and is thus seeking those who may be hard to get in touch with - those who are shut-ins, or hospitalized, for example.

"We want to get ahold of as many people as possible in the Cranbrook area, so they can tell their story," LeClair said.

LeClair said the process wasn't that easy, because of privacy issues. "They can't tell us, for example, if someone's in the hospital."

The book itself will be quite comprehensive, LeClair says. Once published - in magazine form - it will be distributed free to all branches in the country.

Anyone who has served with the Canadian Forces, or anyone who knows someone who served who is not aware of the project, is asked to contact the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 24 in Cranbrook 250-426-4512.
